

December 3, 2017 1st Sunday of Advent

"Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come." On this First Sunday of Advent, Jesus gives us a wakeup call. This is no time for slumber. Now is the time to be on our toes, alert, attentive, ready. But for what? For the coming of "the Lord of the house."

During Advent, the Church does her best to help us get ready for the second coming of Christ. We don't know precisely when he will return, but we know that he will. And the fact is, even if it doesn't happen in our lifetime, each and every one of us will still have to face the Lord at an unknown hour-namely, the hour of our death. So let us be prepared! During these weeks as we prepare our homes for the festive holiday season, may we also set aside some time and effort to prepare our hearts. Then, not only will we appreciate the yuletide wonders around us, but we can also look forward to the eternal wonders that lie in store.

Often Less is Better

It's that time of year! Even before Thanksgiving (or worse, Halloween) Christmas decorations are everywhere. It seems that at every turn there are brighter lights, more glitter and larger blow-up Santas. Christmas Carols crowd out every other form of music, everywhere we go. Whatever happened to that quiet winter night in a stable?

Advent gives us the opportunity to reflect on what really matters in our hearts and in our families. It is counter-cultural, but valuable, to tell our children and family members that this is NOT the time for going all-out on wild and crazy, expensive, latest, greatest gifts. Do we think this is the way to show others we love them?

Scott Peck's definition of love is, "The will to extend one's self for the purpose of nurturing one's own or another's spiritual growth." Often our spiritual growth is nurtured by saying "no" to buying things to give to those who don't need them. Especially for children, the "magic" of Christmas can become a competition to see which gift is the favorite. Even grandparents feel obliged to out-do one another. When there are heaps of gifts under the tree they can rob us of quality time to spend nurturing the relationships that are the real treasures. Finding the "perfect gift" can distract us from the meaning of the season, the truth that God loves each one of us just as we are.

Can we find the courage to resist the materialism that surrounds us? Can we say no to buying the cell phone, the fancy bicycle or the designer jeans for a ten-year-old? Can we set an example by giving simple gifts, little ones, picked with thoughtfulness or made by hand? We do not demonstrate love by extravagant giving but seeking *our own or another's spiritual growth*.

Can we choose to spend time reflecting on the privilege of our lives rather than racing to one more store or cooking one more fancy dinner? Will this Advent be a new beginning for us?
