

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

March 11, 2018 4th Sunday of Lent

Why is the world the way it is? We all wonder that from time to time. Each successive generation projects rose-hued longing on the past and casts furtive glances at the impending future. We see forces beyond our control in nature and in the newspaper. The world is changing and we're being pulled out with the tide.

In the face of this confusion, today's Gospel features one of the most often quoted Scripture verses of all time: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." But if Christ has come, why is the world so challenging? Why is the world still -- to our eyes -- being carried off in a proverbial hand basket? Jesus' response is a deeply personal one. "This is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light." Patterns arise, habits are formed, and systems become engrained, but each is the result of an interconnected web of human choices.

Where do we stand? Our answers, perhaps, vary from week to week, hour to hour, missed traffic light to spilled coffee to teenage child's rebellion. The world isn't perfect because we aren't perfect. Our parish is flawed because we're flawed. Our families need work because every one of us needs to be converted. Christianity is a process, not a destination! This Sunday, Jesus invites us to consider our own lives. Where in our own lives do we prefer darkness to light? What flaws are we trying to hide? Humbly acknowledge those places today. Ask God for the grace to be transformed. Share with your spouse or a friend where you'd like to improve this week. "Whoever loves truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God."

Fourth Sunday of Lent

We might think of candles and light more during the Advent season than during Lent, due to Advent wreaths, candles in windows, and the light of a star. But the real focus on light, as seen in this week's Gospel, is during Lent, when we prepare for Easter and Jesus' triumphant rising from the dead. It is in this game-changing event that the light of Christ destroys the power of darkness.

If you have never been to an Easter Vigil, why not plan on attending this year? The theme of light is so prevalent, with processional candles everywhere and the new Paschal candle being lit for the first time. The candle is then plunged into the baptismal font before it is used for sacraments, breaking into the darkness of our sin. Through these waters, men and women will be washed clean and the darkness they were born into will exist no more. Their blindness of original sin will be healed and they will not only be able to see, they will be new creations in Christ.

This Lent, before it is all over, spend time in prayer and use a candle to focus. Reflect on your life and determine what areas you need the light of Christ to shine. Then when Easter comes, know that the One who is the light is shining brighter than ever so you may be in darkness no more.

The Death of Our Father, Mike Newman



Our family at ODS, and all of Chico, grieves the death of Father Mike

Newman on March 1, 2018. He was 79 years young! The last couple of months were challenging with health problems, but in true Fr. Mike style he found the courage and hope to do his best with the health demands he faced. He knew we were all praying for him, as a parish and as individuals, and he appreciated that greatly.

Father Mike's time in Chico was long and full, beginning with his leadership and love for the Newman Center for 13 years, and followed by his "retirement" which, as we all know, really wasn't! Our family at ODS was blessed with his homilies, his jokes, and his generous service at weekend and daily Masses. His assistance with the Penance Services and Healing Masses touched our hearts and encouraged us. At weddings or funerals he was fully involved with the people who were celebrating or grieving and each one became his friend. We remember with gratitude sharing his 50 year celebration of ordination.

Fr. Mike had a special love for youth and showed it. He was always ready to step out and support those who are marginalized or homeless. He was a member of the Chico Interfaith Council and worked to break down barriers and form bonds between people of all faiths. He was state chaplain for two years for both the Catholic Daughters and the Knights of Columbus. He was active in the national leadership of the Salvadorians as well, and savored his travels to be with his community of priests and friends.

Can't you see him now? He is singing "Zippity do dah, zippity a. My oh my what a wonderful day!" His cheer and joy will be forever praising our God. There is no doubt that his joy will be shared with us on Easter morning, as always, even though his physical presence is gone from our sight. We will miss you, Father Mike!
