Focus on a Local - Gill Waugh

The Northwood resident for this newsletter edition is Gill Waugh. Gill is the Senior Pastor at the Christchurch North Salvation Army Church, which is on the corner of Main North Road and Donegal Street. Gill, her late husband Neil (who sadly passed away only 11 months ago to cancer), with their two sons, had moved down from West Auckland to Christchurch three and a half years ago to become Co-Pastors. Gill lives with both of her sons: Caleb who is nearly 21, and 23year-old Ethan, his partner Nive and their 14 month-old toddler.

Gill and the team are based in Belfast (794 Main North Rd), during the week and are kept busy with the foodbank, budgeting, connecting with people around their needs, advocacy, one-to-one coaching, life skills and more. The office is open from Monday-Thursday 9.30am-12.30pm and the foodbank runs on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9.30-12.30pm. Access to the foodbank is by appointment with people encouraged to ring the church in the mornings and make a time. Also available is the Healthy Fruit & Vege Co-op where for \$15 you can receive 8kgs of fresh fruit and vegetables. Anyone can pre-order by dropping into the Centre by 10.30am on a Monday with your money and then pick up their order on a



Wednesday. They also have bread available on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from approximately 11.30am for people to take to help them spread out the groceries for the week.

Gill, with the team, leads the 10am Sunday Service in Northcote School Hall (Tuckers Rd) where anyone is welcome to attend and share in the service. The service is family-oriented, informal and welcoming. Family events such as movie and games nights are organised on a regular basis, and special events on Mother's and Father's day. They no longer have the room at the centre at Belfast to hold these services, and are in fact looking long term at building something that fits their needs better. Gill and her team support people in Belfast, Casebrook, Northcote and Redwood.

Later this year when the Salvation Army hosts a stall at the Northwood Fair on Sunday 6 November, they will have games available for children to play such as "guess the jelly beans in the jar", and will use the opportunity to connect and get to know residents. They are keen to learn about issues facing the community which they may be able to support.

Important to Gill is her strong faith in God, her family and building relationships with people in her community. Gill is grateful to the community for the support the Salvation Army receives as together they work with others in the community to support and care for people.

It was an honour to meet Gill. We need people like her and her team to support vulnerable people in our community. If you would like to volunteer your time, the Family Stores are always needing volunteers, call into the Family Store in Cranford Street and ask for the Manager. Any donations can also be dropped directly to the Cranford Street store. If you would like to donate any non-perishable food, drop items into the Belfast Salvation Army Centre. They are always needing plastic bags!

Neighbourhood Clean Up

Northwood Residents Association will be running the next "Neighbourhood Clean Up" on **Saturday**, **27**th **August**. The clean-up will focus on trimming back overgrown vegetation and clearing fallen leaves etc. from underneath existing plants.

This is a new initiative by your Committee and will be a regular activity run by the NRA to show residents, visitors and CCC that we care about Northwood and are prepared to give some personal time to help maintain our neighbourhood to the standard that we expect.

To join us at the clean-up on **27th August**, meet at the **north side of Northwood Park alongside the Kaputone Stream down to the reserve area by Crombie Green**. Please remember to bring your gardening gloves and a smile.

Safety Underfoot

NRA has been proactive regarding pedestrian safety around Northwood. If you have been over the bridge on Northwood Park – Englefield Reserve, you will notice the new non-slip mesh which has been applied to the wooden surface.

Since then NRA has requested feedback from the community regarding other areas of concern. Several residents have identified other wooden walkway surfaces that are very slippery in winter conditions.

NRA has worked at getting these surfaces remediated. We have already improved the walkway on Springwater Avenue. We hope you have noticed and appreciate this change.

NRA reminds residents that they should continue to take care in wet and icy conditions. While these measures improve the surface, they cannot guarantee a completely non-slip surface.

Footpaths around Northwood

NRA has had several calls concerning shrubs and trees that are growing over footpaths. We need to remind residents that some of your neighbours are people who have access issues when trying to negotiate footpaths that are overgrown. It actually becomes a safety issue if the other side of the footpath is sloping away.

If your property has hedges and foliage that overhang the concrete footpaths around Northwood, could you please ensure that the full footpath width is available for wheel chairs, prams, mobility scooters and the general public.

Christchurch City Council has a defined policy around this as follows:

Private property

Under the Local Government Act, property owners are required to trim trees or shrubs obstructing a footpath, road, street sign or waterway. The Council will contact property owners about obstructions. Property owners have a limited time to clear any obstruction before the Council will arrange for the work to be done and charged to the property owner.

Talk to your neighbour if their tree or shrub is causing issues. The Council will not act or give advice on behalf of one resident against another or mediate in disputes.

For further information contact the Community Law Centre, a lawyer or the Citizens Advice Bureau.

NRA encourages all property owners to follow this policy and this is a timely reminder to get your hedges cut back. We strongly advocate that every property owner takes this responsibility seriously and does the right thing. We recommend regular maintenance throughout the year to ensure that this policy is adhered to. If you think your neighbour is not complying and may be unaware of their responsibility, please consider talking to them about it.

In cases where owners are not compliant, NRA will advise the Council. From that point onwards, the by-law will be enforced.

Finally, we would like to thank the majority of residents who play their part in ensuring their shrubs are kept trimmed allowing us all unimpaired access past your property.

Eucalyptus Gum Trees on Saracen Avenue

NRA has been working with local residents to look at constructive ways of improving the residential environment around the six large gum trees on Saracen Avenue.

Many of us walking past these trees would have noticed the large amount of debris that falls from these trees throughout the year. In windy weather, local properties and gardens have been littered with gum nuts, leaves, twigs and huge strips of bark.

Because of this, there is a small number of residents who have to regularly clear the debris from their properties and also the adjacent berms, footpaths and road gutters. We think that this is unfair and that things need to change.

NRA has begun discussions with CCC regarding this situation. After meeting with residents and listening to their issues, NRA has begun a programme to reduce this issue and possibly stop it completely.

In the short term, we have asked the CCC arborists to review the maintenance programme for these trees and begin an assessment of them. So far, the council has responded to this initial request very positively. Within a short period of time, they have cleared the debris from the street gutters.

Additionally, arborists have removed loose and hanging bark from the trees and this has alleviated the immediate issue for our residents.

While NRA is pleased with the initial response, it does not address the issue of continued debris of leaves and gum nuts being shed in high winds. We see these measures as short-term and believe it will require continued regular maintenance by the council to keep the trees from shedding bark into residents' properties.

Because of the proximity to houses, the sheer size of these trees and extent of branches overhanging the footpath and road, NRA proposes to open discussion with CCC around a more appropriate tree planting programme with a possibility of removing these trees. NRA acknowledges that, while removal of large trees is contentious, a suitable planting programme could enhance this area of Northwood so we can all enjoy it.
