Focus on a Local - Bruce Campbell

Our focus person for this newsletter is NRA committee member Bruce Campbell.

Bruce and his partner Pam built in Northwood in 2013 after their home in Christchurch's East was demolished after the quakes. Their search for a suitable location for a brand new home was extensive. They were very much focused on an area with a real community feel, such as homes within an area within geographical boundaries; (for example, Northwood is enclosed by Johns Road and Main North Road). They felt that Northwood ticked all the boxes with it diverse range of housing; and facilities such as the nearby supermarket, retail centre, Northwood Villas, Country Club, cafes and parks.

Bruce and Pam have three adult children and two grandchildren. Spending time with family is an important part of their lives. In their spare time they will sometimes holiday in a caravan and take their grandchildren with them. They also love to have friends over and have a beautiful garden and deck to do just that.



Bruce grew up in rural Canterbury and travels around the South Island in his job working for a New Zealand importer of farm machinery. The day before our interview (during one of our many hot days), Bruce said it had been 36 degrees Celsius whilst on a farm he was visiting!

Bruce has been a past president of the New Brighton Lions and is still active within that organisation. He has always been very conscious of looking after his own community and having a say in improving it, and for these reasons joined the Northwood Residents Association. Since joining the NRA he has helped to instigate our neighbourhood clean-up days. Bruce feels that small contributions which keep Northwood looking nice, demonstrate pride in our community.

Thank you Bruce for all that you do in Northwood. Like all NRA committee members, he is conscious that residents can do a lot to look after their own community.

Belfast Emergency Response Plan - BERP

The Belfast Emergency Response Plan had been developed as a collaborative community response to Civil Defence Emergencies if they were to affect the Belfast and wider Belfast area.

The BERP works as a collaborative and meets on a needs basis. BERP as a collaborative is prepared to operate emergency centres in Civil Defence emergencies. BERP operates a Civil Defence Community Hub within Sheldon Park at 710 Main North Road, Belfast.

The five key venues for managing a response are:

- Belfast Rugby Club for a 36 hour scale event
- Belfast Primary School for a larger, 48 hour + scale event
- Belfast Community Network building 48 hour + event
- Belfast Bowling Club 48 hour + event and
- Belfast Medical Centre

In the first instance BERP's response to a significant emergency event – where electricity supply or road routes are cut off for more than six hours, or a civil emergency is declared will always open Venue 1 (Belfast Rugby Club) until Venue 2 (Belfast Primary School) has been evacuated.

If the BERP were to be activated the following roles/sections will be activated:

Communications Belfast Community Network **Co-supervision** Rugby Club (Venue 1) • School Principal/Deputy Belfast Primary School (Venue 2) Medical Triage at Belfast Medical Centre . Catering Belfast Bowling Club and Salvation Army • Accommodation Sleeping area at Belfast Rugby Club . Showering Belfast Rugby Club Clothing Belfast Salvation Army . **Door knocking checks** Belfast Rotary, Belfast Residents' Association and Northwood Residents' Association

Our role, the NRA, is conducting door knocking checks in the neighbourhood to check on community wellbeing and make sure that residents are ok.

NRA Relationships

At Northwood Residents Association we work in close partnership with Christchurch City Council on a weekly basis on an array of issues.

You really couldn't miss the very large advertising trailer for Texture Plants that turned up on the roadside next to the Northwood entrance. Something this big gives a lot of us the impression that someone must have asked to do this. Well... not so. Northwood Residents Association used its excellent contacts and relationship with the City Council support staff and raised the issue of the advertising trailer. When we made contact with the council on the 4th Of March 2016 Council was unaware the billboard had been parked on their corner reserve. Within hours, the wheels turned and the right people were notified. NRA were responsible for getting the offending trailer removed. In the process, the company responsible was fined.

Thanks go to residents who also contacted us regarding this issue. It's good to know that when something needs doing, NRA is contacted. Thankfully, by the time we were reached, by phone and Facebook, the issue was already being processed.

This has been a simple but effective illustration of NRA in action for Northwood and working for the community.

We are also working alongside Council and NZTA around safety issues on the pedestrian crossing on Main North Road Intersection which has involved a large piece of work that we have compiled over the last three years with improvements being implemented to the intersection. We still are working on this project with the safety of pedestrians in mind.

If you ever see anything around Northwood that you are unsure of please reach out to us at Northwood Residents Association so we can reach out to our contacts at the council and we can get things investigated. But also if you see issues around the neighbourhood that you know are not right please make contact with the Christchurch City Council through the contact centre 941 8999 or through the council application of Snap Send Solve.

New Park Benches

Following the last AGM it was agreed that the NRA would install two park benches in the Northwood Park. The benches were installed in November 2015. Not only do they look great but they provide a nice resting place for those watching any sport or just taking a break. Thank you to Midas Northwood for helping attach the plaques.



Security

Recently there has been a spike in the number of vehicle and property break-ins and thefts across the neighbourhood.

This is not something that we want to see in Northwood.

Some tips to help make our neighbourhood safer include:

- Keep valuables out of site if they are in your car overnight
- Remember to lock your vehicles and homes when you head out or overnight
- Report any untoward behavior, thefts or breakins to the Police as soon as possible
- If you see anyone acting suspicious contact the Police
