

2: VINTAGE-STYLE LIGHTING

The combination of generous proportions, weathered bronze frame and crystal clear glass gives a contemporary look to an old style of fitting – and the extra ingredient adding some magic is the special antique filament bulb. This design feature not only reinforces the aged style of the product, but also, the colour of the light provided by this vintagestyle bulb creates a soft, warm, almost candle-like glow.

This style of light works best when placed low over a dining table or extended kitchen island. The unfussy lines mean that even a slightly oversized fitting works well because it doesn't impose too heavily on the space.
