

Job Description

Position: Eurythmy

Status: Full time, blocks as scheduled

Hours:

Monday-Friday, as scheduled between 8:30 and 3:00

Minimum Qualifications:

Bachelor's degree from an accredited university Eurythmy training Some previous teaching experience preferred

Primary Duties:

Classroom Responsibilities and Duties:

1. Class Teaching

- Prepare and teach subject curriculum, guided by the principles of Waldorf education.
- Develop and maintain a safe, harmonious social environment for the students.
- Provide regular communication to Class Teachers about curriculum, student performance and unusual incidents.
- Begin and end classes on time to support Class Teachers' daily schedule.

2. Parent Meetings

- Attend at least one (1) Class/Parent meeting to explain subject curriculum, answer parent questions, and foster familiarity between parents and Subject Teachers.
- Be available for parent-teacher conferences which may be scheduled in October and March, or on an as needed basis. Conferences will allow the teacher and parent(s) time to discuss the child's social, artistic, and intellectual development and to work together in support of the child's development and school experiences.
- Arrange and participate in conference(s) with parent and support faculty member, as needed, to discuss student academic or disciplinary concerns.

3. Reports and Parent Conferences

- Document observations of each student related to successes and challenges of presented curriculum.
- Complete End of Year Report narratives covering student's progress in subject class.
- Reports are to be submitted by assigned deadline date to be reviewed for suggested edits by assigned peer. Due dates will be distributed by LWS at least 4 weeks in advance.

Expectations for Eurythmist:

- One (1) class each Early childhood class and Grades 1 & 2: 5 classes/week total
- One or two classes each week with 3rd grade (at your discretion)
- Two classes each week in 4th-8th grades: 10 classes/week total
- The schedule is such that each day you will have either three or four classes. Piano accompaniment provided for Grades classes.
- A 10-15 minute Eurythmy practice with the faculty at the beginning of each Thursday faculty meeting.
- An evening or a Saturday workshop or presentation for parents (1-1.5 hrs)
- Sharing at an all-school assembly the Eurythmy work of selected grades.
- A brief summary of the block or a one-paragraph overview of the work you did for each class to be included in the year-end reports -- no individual student reports.
