SPEC SHEET TERMINOLOGY

A spec sheet contains information regarding the garments trim requirements. The spec sheet will indicate the button sizes, twill tape lengths, zippers, waistband widths, draw cord length etc. Spec Sheets, may also contain a design sketch to help the factory view a complete rendering of the intended garment. The file may also include brand label and care label requirements for the product.

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SPEC SHEET TERMINOLOGY

TERMINOLOGY:

Edgestitch: to seam or stitch for decoration along a fold line of (a piece of cloth)

Flatlock: made by bringing two raw edges together and covering them with machine stitching

Topstitch: a row of continuous stitches on the top or right side of a garment or other article as a decorative feature.

Overlock: An overlock is a kind of stitch that sews over the edge of one or two pieces of cloth for edging, Hemming, or seaming. Usually an overlock sewing machine will cut the edges of the cloth as they are fed through (such machines being called "sergers" in North America), though some are made without cutters.

2N Coverseam: 2 needle coverseam

3N Coverseam: 3 needle coverseam

Baby Merrow:

Blindstitch: the method of joining two pieces of fabric so that the stitch thread is invisible, or nearly invisible.

Bartack: a stitch made to strengthen a potential weak spot in a garment or other sewn item

J-stitch

Zig Zag stitch

Dbl ndl: Double needle

Sngl ndl: Single Needle

CF: Cross Front

BL: Body Length

CW: Chest Width

AH: Armhole

CB: Cross back

DTM: Dyed to Match

BNW: Back Neck Width

FND: Front Neck Drop

BND: Back Neck Drop

CO: Cuff Opening

WB: Waist Band

HPS: High Shoulder Point

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
