

Who qualifies for home health care?

To qualify for Medicare coverage for home health care, a patient must be:

- Homebound
- Unable to function outside of the home without a considerable and taxing effort (i.e., with the aid of another person and/or assistive device)
- Have an exacerbation of an existing illness or onset of a new disease process
- Require nursing, PT/OT, speech pathology on an intermittent basis
