On 5th May 2018 BCWA celebrated its 40th anniversary. The celebration service was well attended by past students (alumni) and staff who still have fond memories of their college days.

Founding Principal, Rev. Dr. David Shalley shared about the origins of the college and its progression in ministry with the current Principal, the Rev. Dr. Dawson Elliott sharing about



the continuation of that original vision within the contemporary climate of Bible College. Pastor Cheng Lai Lim was the keynote speaker. He graduated at BCWA and is the founder of Faith Community Church in Perth.

The theme for the 40th Anniversary was "Faithful to the Calling."



God has indeed been good to BCWA over the past 40 years. As I envision the future, I am reminded of Paul's words- "But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining towards what is ahead, I press on towards the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenwards in Christ Jesus" (Phil.3:13b &14) – Dawson Elliott/Principal.

Reaching a milestone of 40 years is impressive; but doing so in a theological climate is a feat that is worthy to be pleased of.

The college we know today, began life in the busy heyday of the late 70's, during a time when many new ideas and movements were gaining ground. Some of these ideas helped to advance mankind, whilst others became not much more than conversation pieces around water coolers and weekend barbeques. In the midst of this period, there was a stirring in the theological spirit of many who wanted:

- A deeper sense of spiritual formation and personal development,
- Learning outcomes that are deeply biblical, and practical, just the way Christ had intended.

To satisfy this need, one would have had to decide between the only two options available, namely:

- Church based educational programs, and
- Traditional Theological Colleges

From a theological and practical viewpoint, there existed a gap between these two options, and it was the need to fill this gap – that became the vision for Rev. Dr. Max Wells – who went on to establish what we all know today as the 'Bible College of Western Australia'.







Some of the main points of Pastor Cheng Lai's message from Philippians 2:12-18 were as follows:

There are three things we can learn from the Apostle Paul in this passage in Philippians 2:12-18:

- 1. We have a purpose to achieve Philippians 2:12.
- 2. We have a power to receive Philippians 2:13
- 3. We have a Joy to receive Philippians 2:16-18.

It is not merely our wisdom, our skills or even our training, but it is the Holy Spirit that resides within us that enables us to fulfill the purposes of God in the calling that He has given to each one of us. Colossians 1:29 tells us that whilst we labour or work; it is the energy of the Holy Spirit that works so powerfully in us. It is Christ in us, the hope of glory that is the key to Faithfulness – Colossians 1:27.

Our internship program is ensuring our students get on the job training and fulfil their calling in their respective churches.

Apart from the accredited and self-accredited training streams, BCWA has also offered "youth-surge" studies in "Ephesians: ultimate social network" for teens called ENGAGE.

This will be ongoing in Semester 2/2018.

A theological forum, "Conversations on Sexuality" was also held on 28 April with Dr. Viktor Zander presenting and engaging the students in holistic discussion.

A <u>Worship Seminar/Workshop</u> was held on 19 May. Dr. Dawson Elliott and trainee Pastor, Diony Escarilla who is gifted in the area of music and worship led the sessions.

To close this semester off, BCWA is hosting a **Worship Night [PLUNGE]** on 16 June 2018 (6.30pm -8.30pm). A few churches will be participating in leading us in this 'worship-a-thon' in going deeper in worship of our God. *A sumptuous Filipino dinner pack* will be sold for just \$10 from 5pm -6.20pm.
