TRANSPORT SAFETY POLICY

Policy

The safety of the young person will be considered paramount whenever they are being transported by workers and volunteers as part of the programme.

BBBSN workers and volunteers will set a good example to young people regarding the use of motor vehicles by ensuring that they obey all road rules and relevant legislation

Coverage

This policy relates to all workers and volunteers and young persons and any other contracted persons who may be employed for the purposes of providing a service for BBBSN.

Guidelines

All vehicles used to transport young people will have a current registration, warrant of fitness, at least third party insurance and will be adequately maintained.

Seat belts are to be used by all occupants of the vehicle when transporting young people.

Drivers Licenses

BBBSN will ensure that workers and volunteers who will be transporting young people in the course of their work have a clean and current driver license.

Volunteer Mentor applicants will be asked to disclose any driving convictions in their application. The nature of any convictions will be taken into consideration when deciding if a mentor is accepted on to the programme.

A photocopy of the volunteer mentor's driving license will be placed on file.

Driving conviction s

If a volunteer mentor receives a driving conviction they must inform the Programme Director of the matter and supply an explanation regarding the circumstances of the incident.

The Programme Director will consider if the conviction(s) will affect the volunteer mentor's position on the programme.

Young drivers

BBBSN volunteer mentors will not allow any young person to have control of a vehicle on the road.
