

The duties of Lodi's Fair Fairest of the Fair:

As Lodi's Fairest of the Fair, your reign will begin from the date of the first community event you are given (this may change to what is going on in town.) You will be given your tiara and sash early, but your official crowning will be Thursday night of the Lodi Ag Fair. Your reign is from that night until the new Fairest is crowned the next year. Please be ready to make as many public appearances and meet as many people as our fair ambassador so you can invite everyone come to our fair. During the fair, we will have a schedule for you, the Jr. Fairest and the honor court, so you will know where and when you are to be at a fair event.

Events may include attending the Dane County Breakfast on the Farm or the Columbia County Moo Brunch, announcing at our Meat and Animal Sale, speaking at the Pie Auction, Derby events, Tractor Pull, Animal Show classes, etc. You will escort the WI Fairest of the Fair to the events that are happening on the day she visits Lodi.

After the fair is over, please plan to attend Susie Duck Days and ride in the parade, you will be assisting with the Duck Drop. You may also be asked to speak at a Rotary or Optimist meeting, etc. and the Arlington Parade is also on the list of possibilities. If you have a specific event you would like to be at, just ask, we can locate a convertible and driver if you need one for a parade for example.

It is very important that the image of the Lodi Fairest of the Fair is kept in a respectable manner. Please dress in appropriate skirts, capris, or summer dresses. There will not be low-cut tops, crop tops or too-short skirts or shorts allowed. Remember that you may need to have on a "safe" pair of shoes if you are around animals. Flip Flops are not recommended for this reason.

The annual WI Association of Fairs Convention is held in around Jan 5th (Sunday-Wednesday) of Christmas break where the competition for the WI State Fairest takes place. It is a wonderful 3-day experience with making new friends, learning about the media, interviews, etc. If your schedule allows, we encourage you to attend. The fair will pay for your attendance, which is \$200 and non-refundable, so it is really important to show up. If you attend the fairest convention, the fair provides you an extra \$100 to purchase a suit for this competition.

The Fairest is awarded a \$300.00 scholarship and given at the end of the summer. The Fairest court will be awarded tiaras and sashes and will make appearances during the Lodi Fair to fill in as much as possible.
