

HIGHTOWN SPOIL HOMECOMING

Women's Premier Division champions Slough started the next chapter in their illustrious history with a home game against Hightown at their new Upton Court ground. However the celebrations were somewhat spoiled by the visitors who recorded a fine 4-2 win. In the corresponding fixture last season Slough won 10-1 and with their GB international keeper Carolyn Reid registered too late to play Hightown can be exceptionally pleased with Saturday's result. Last season's league runners up Olton enjoyed their trip down the M5 to Clifton where they came from behind twice before Vanessa Hawkins 67th minute winner gave them the points. They also came away with Lucie Beim's transfer to boost their squad and have also signed Jacqui Davis from Liverpool Quilter. Two Lisa Wooding goals helped Chelmsford to a 2-1 win at Fyffes Leicester. Newly promoted Doncaster were the only home team to take all three points and did so in a 3-2 win over Ipswich. This week they are joined by Australian U21 player Katherine Paterson. Sutton and Canterbury played out a 1-1 draw in the other game in the Division.

In Men's Division Two the Trinidadian influence at East Grinstead was immediately apparent at Barford Tigers. Their new player-coach Kwan Browne scored twice and his compatriot Dwain Quan Chan was also on the scoresheet in a 7-1 win. All the goals came in a busy last half hour which saw Barford take the lead, Ben Payne netted a hat-trick for the visitors. . Barford will hope that the arrival of Sarpreet Mehat from Nottingham will see an upturn in fortunes. The battle of the new boys saw Old Georgians win 3-2 at Leek thanks to a hat-trick from James Tindall. Formby defeated Bath Buccaneers 2-1 and Lewes beat Hounslow & Ealing 2-0. Hounslow have signed Josh Smith from Firebrands and he is registered to play this week.

LEAGUE RESTART FOR OTHER FOUR DIVISIONS

Premiership champions Reading have added to their squad with Simon Mantell of Firebrands joining his brother Richard at the club along with South African Todd Hutchenson. League winners Cannock have made surely the surprise signing of the season with Nick Thompson joining after 16 seasons

The have seen Kwan Browne move to East Grinstead and Huw Jones to Hampstead who have also signed Paddy Aldridge from Southgate, Andy Heslop from Bournville and Paul Turk from East Grinstead. Teddington have strengthened their squad with French national team sweeper Nicolas Jean-Jean joining along with David Tyler from Bournville and Graeme Egan of Old Loughtonians. Guildford have seen Roly Ward leave for Firebrands, Jon Evennett join Isca and Adrian Wilkinson move to Havant. They have been joined by Jonathon Sprakes from Havant, James Kingstone of Hounslow & Ealing. St Albans have no major signings but have retained most of last season's squad.

Beeston, who narrowly missed out on promotion from Mens Division One last season, have signed Welsh international goalkeeper Matt Simkin from Stourport and Adam Palmer from Southgate. Their near neighbours Nottingham who were promoted from Division Two in 2002-03 have kept most of their squad together with the exception of Sarpreet Mehat who has joined Barford. Doncaster also have a new overseas player Danny Thien from Australia and new players from closer to home include Richard Gill (Harleston), Duncan Parnis (St Albans) and Matt Quade (Beeston). Firebrands welcome back Roly Ward from Guildford who started his career with the Bristol club and England U16 player Will Pearce moves down the M5 from Cheltenham. Southgate have

seen a number of players depart but on the plus side have re-signed John Bell from Hampstead. Stourport welcome back Pakistani brothers Irfan and Imran Yousaf and the latter will also coach the side.

In Womens Division One last season's runners up Harleston Magpies will rely on roughly the same squad to try and gain one of the two promotion places available. Newly promoted Poynton have seen Helen Pawley join from Bradford and Rachel Custard move from relegated Deeside. Loughborough's influx of newcomers include Kath Bradley and Claire Gavin from Fyffes Leicester, Katie Richards from Liverpool, Mel Bennett from Bradford, Sarah Wilcox from Chelmsford and Laura Gittings of Doncaster. Trojans have retained the services of Alex Danson and have signed a Hong Kong international, Sandra Frankland who is studying in Bath. In Womens Division Two University of Birmingham, who narrowly missed out on promotion last season welcome Laura Bainbridge from Clifton. The North of the country has seen players switching clubs with Fiona Harland joining Liverpool from Bradford, Bradford signing Chantal Mann and Liz Shelswell from Leyland Motors and Leyland picking up Jessica Bowman from Hightown.

STRUCTURE OF ENGLISH HOCKEY LEAGUE

Following the consultation process over amendments to the structure of the English Hockey League in season 2004-05, the Board of England Hockey met on Monday 22 September to discuss this matter. The Board were conscious of the need for any new structure to be agreed prior to the start of the season, so that clubs are aware of the implications and know what they are playing for in the forthcoming season.

The Board welcomed David Alcock, Chairman of the EHL Committee, Laurie Alcock, Chairman of the Review Group and Stephen Barlow, England Hockey Competitions & Events Manager to the meeting.

The proposals were debated in detail together with the results of the consultation process.

It was noted that less than half of the 62 EHL clubs had responded to the request for feedback. A number of these clubs did not support the proposal specifically the promotion/relegation system with five teams being promoted and five relegated each season. These clubs would prefer to keep some form of a play offs system as currently exists.

The Board believed that the proposal offered a number of positive points. Specifically the proposal means that access to the English Hockey League is dependant on a season's hockey not a play off tournament. In addition, for a number of clubs, the costs of playing at this level will be significantly reduced with the first half of the season in the National Divisions played on a semi-national basis. World Class Hockey Ltd supports the format of the Premier Division as this competition will enhance the development of international players within the domestic game.

The Board believe that the radical proposal will offer a highly competitive English Hockey League structure and will also act as a spur to clubs throughout the game in Regional Leagues. Whilst noting existing EHL clubs concerns about 5 teams being relegated each season they would stress that the league is being enlarged before the proposal takes effect. Fears about relegation should be somewhat offset by the quicker route back into the National level.

After deliberation, the Board agreed to introduce the proposed structure for the EHL for season 2004-05, including the addition of the Welsh Women's champions.

The Board asked the Review Group, in conjunction with the EHL committee, to further examine:

- The question of a carry over of points or reward based on results in the first half of the season
- The regulations regarding transfers so as to restrict player movement at the midseason break.

In addition the board request that the Review Group work with Regional Leagues, where there are currently play offs between County and Regional Divisions, to look to implement a structure which offers all clubs a clear pathway with progression based on a season's results.

The Board believe that the Review Group has provided an innovative structure for the top end of the domestic game and hopes that clubs will support this new initiative and see the positive aspects therein. The Board recognises that this represents a significant change to the existing league structure and encourages due feedback, once it is in operation, to ensure that any ongoing concerns are heard and may be acted upon as appropriate.
