

Hampstead v. Surbiton.—Result: Hampstead 3, Surbiton 0. On the Surbiton club's new ground, and under tropical conditions, these two old opponents had a fast and well contested game. S. H. Shoveller scored all three points, and played with all his usual cleverness. Surbiton were once or twice within an ace of scoring, but their forwards were weak in the circle, and with the exception of Shoveller, this remark also applies to Hampstead. Hampstead's left half, a new member, played well, as did J. H. Bennett, last year's Oxford University full back, who has joined Hampstead. Orr played very well indeed at centre half, doing a lot of useful work. Roger Harvey and the two Eglingtones gave a capital display for the losers. Mr. Beavan was the only umpire and most ably did he perform his duties.
