CLUB HISTORY

Hampstead Hockey Club started life when, at a General Meeting of Hampstead Cricket Club on April 12th 1894, it was resolved that the hockey section of the cricket club ceased to exist. This blunt statement was not as drastic as it may seem: it was, in fact, the expected result of the decision of the hockey section two days earlier; the cricket club and its hockey section had agreed to part company.

The hockey club existed in its own right from April 13 1894 but hockey had been played from as early as December 1874. There is evidence of a match between Hampstead and Richmond at Old Deer Park at this time.

After certain ground difficulties, the new club played its first game against Wimbledon on October 13 1894. Other opponents during this first season included Bromley, Southgate, Tulse Hill and Teddington.

During the early part of the century, an entry in a minute book provides an interesting commentary on the way we are pampered by modern communications. Richmond kindly offered to share their board at Waterloo Railway Station on which a notice was posted stating whether the game was cancelled. Due to the scarcity of a satisfactory playing area in north London at this time, Hampstead had been playing all its home matches at the Richmond Athletic Ground.

The first post-war match was played on October 21 1950 against Teddington 2nd XI which resulted in a one all draw. During the period 1950/59 Hampstead led a nomadic life. However, in 1959 the club moved to the Hornsey Cricket Club ground in north London, where they have been ever since. They merged with the Hornsey Club in 1975 and so became the hockey section of a club for the second time in history.

Hampstead was a founder member of the London League and now turns out seven men's and two ladies' teams every Saturday. Veteran hockey has developed over the years to the extent that a genuine side turns out every week. Peter Boizot. a member since 1966, became the veterans' first captain in the early 1970s and was suitably honoured by HM The Queen with the award of M.B.E. in 1986. Peter is now the Club President.
