At the time of writing we don't know whether the Council Workers strike will be over or not by Saturday. So to avoid last minute switches we have already re-arranged the games against Hawks. THE FIRST XI WILL START EARLY AT HORNSEY FOLLOWED BY THE 5TH XI AND THE 3RD XI WILL START EARLY AT WEYBRIDGE FOLLOWED BY THE VETERANS XI. Please check the details for your game overleaf and remember that you must go by car to the Hawks round and it is a long journey from North London, so non car-owners fix up your lift in good time.

I forgot, last week, to thank the 1st XI for running a very enjoyable party at Hornsey on the 24th. The turnout was rather disappointing, though, and that's not too good when teams put a lot of effort into running a function. So please try to support the functions throughout the rest of the season - they really are very good fun and excellent value-for-money (they are not designed to make a profit). All work (on a Saturday afternoon) and no play (on Saturday evening) makes Jack a dull boy!

As for the next function - the Club Supper at Hornsey on the 28th. I outlined the details last week. The 2nd XI is negotiating for excellent value for the meal and wines. It will be very informal: the only official guests will be the Oxford University players if they wish to stay on. And no long-drawn-out speeches - just one well-known funny-man whom the 2nd XI is negotiating for. T.Mandair will be handling the ticket arrangements so please return the tear-off slip to him AS SOON AS POSSIBLE (remember we had to turn away late-comers from the 75th Dinner!) Private guests welcomed, though - if tickets go very rapidly - we may have to say 'no room for any more private guests'.

The General Committee will be asked, next week, to express a view on a proposed League to cover the whole of the South Division. Very briefly, what would be involved is one Super League of (probably) 9 clubs, below that 3 Regional Leagues of 9 clubs (for instance, if our 1st XI were in this Regional League rather than the Super League, it would probably play other clubs from Middlesex, Oxfordshire, Berkshire and Buckinghamshire), and below that 3 Area Leagues in each Region, with several Divisions in each Area where there were more than 9 clubs or so. There would be promotion and relegation each season (e.g. 3 clubs down from the Super League and one up from each of the Regional Leagues etc.) If any member has a point of view they would like to express about such a league, would they let me know (preferably in writing!) before the 12th. Incidentally, to guide your thinking, let me tell you that the result of our poll at the beginning of the season was: FOR MORE competitive hockey 23, for LESS competitive hockey 0, for hockey as it is 20. The results, as applied specifically to 1st XI hockey, were very similar - 24 : 1:15.
