With 2 games to go and 4 points clear of the relegation zone a win would ensure Hampstead a place in the Premier League again next season. But Hampstead can't be accused of making it easy for themselves with player/coach Eddie O'Brien back in Australia for Olympic trials and Nigel Land unavailable due to a delayed flight back from Whistler.

In their last encounter Teddington had won 4-2 in what was probably the low point of Hampstead's season. This game therefore shows how much the side has improved in the second half of the season, and the credit that should be given to Todd Williams and the team.

After a disruptive preparation due to late arrival of players stuck in traffic Hampstead started nervously conceding a penalty corner in the first couple of minutes. Fortunately, this was saved by Dodson and from there on Hampstead dominated.

Tim Thompson at centre half showed his calibre and linking well with the forwards eventually got the ball through to Tom Matthews. Tom, Hampstead's 'utility' player had played in most positions this season from left half to centre forward was today starting at left wing. With memories of his days playing for England U21 in the World Cup, Tom picked up the ball at right wing and dribbling along the by-line beat the prostate keeper to put Hampstead ahead after 12 minutes.

Hampstead's dominance continued as they outclassed the Teddington side. This was rewarded after 25 minutes as a superb run by John Bell resulted in the Teddington defence poll axing him in the circle. Despite this challenge, he managed to flash the ball high across the goal. Hilton, instinctively hit this in to make the score 2-0 with one of the most spectacular goals of the season.

With Hampstead now moving the ball smoothly and good performances from youngster Cornick, Thompson and the rejuvenated Sully in midfield Teddington resorted to playing half court to draw Hampstead out. This proved ineffective and at half time Hampstead walked off worthy leaders.

With some good tactical advice from Todd, Hampstead started the second half well with John Bell again showing his class to hit Hampstead's third 3 minutes into the half. The game then unfortunately degenerated as excellent defending consistently foiled the Teddington's attacks. A late consolation for Teddington was a converted penalty stroke but Hampstead maintained control to finish the game 3-1 up and worthy victors.

The difference between this game and the last encounter is dramatic and shows how Hampstead have had a season of two halves. A win next weekend against Doncaster will give Hampstead 13 out of a possible 15 points over the teams outside the top four and set the standard for next season. Well done to Todd, all the players and management, we are now safe from relegation and have an excellent base for another season in the Premier League.
