THE HISTORY OF THE CLUB (PART ONE)..... The Hampstead Hockey club came into being in April 1894 when at a meeting at the 'Eyre Arms' in Hampstead, it was decided, because of the wet state of the cricket ground, that the hockey section of the Hampstead Cricket Club cease to exist, and that the newly formed club would find a ground elsewhere. It was agreed that the uniform would be a shirt of cricket club colours and a dark blue cap. The founder members were Messrs Besch, McMillin, Brown J, Ravenor, Giles, Teller, Rutland, Brown B, Hale, Lawrence, Mergerstein, Petty, , Bishop, Danver, Brown S, Lipscombe and Danby.

The first ground the new body found was at Elms Farma, near Garden Lene in Acton, changing at the nearby 'George and Dragon'. The first match was against Willesden, and amongst those played in the first season, and still on our fixture list, were Bromley,

Tulse Hill, Teddington and Southgate.
